What is “Neighborhood watch in daily life”?

It means readily keeping watch over the safety of children while going about daily life.

Shopping

Jogging

Walking your dog

Commuting

Gardening

Things to watch out for...

When you are out, try to be a little more attentive of children and their surroundings.

Signs that a child may be in danger:

- A suspicious person is talking to or taking pictures of children
- A suspicious car is following children

When something seems off...

Call the **police** (110)

If you come across a crime or accident:

Ensure your own **safety** first and then **call 110**.



Children are likely to be victims of crime or accidents when they are returning from school, or when they are without adult supervision after school. Please watch over them **between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.**

When on patrol...

- Check for children playing alone.
- Pay special attention to places where children are known to gather, such as school routes and parks.
- Smile and greet those around you.

Keep in mind

- Help to the best of your abilities without overdoing yourself
- Always obey traffic rules



For your safety, **do not go after perpetrators**, even if you catch them committing a crime. Your **ultimate role is to call the police!**
